STATEMENT.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that B. F. GLADDING & Co. Inc., a corporation duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of New York, and located and doing business at South Otselic, in the county of Chenango and State of New York, has adopted and used the trade-mark shown in the accompanying drawing, no claim being made to the exclusive use of the words or numerals "Braided Silk Casting Line, No. 4, 50 Yds." apart from the mark as shown on the drawing, for braided silk

casting lines, in Class 22, Games, toys, and sporting goods.

The trade mark has been continuously used in the business of said corporation since April 25, 1913.

The trade mark is affixed to the ends of the spools upon which the lines are wound, by printing the same directly thereon, or by attaching thereto printed labels on which the trade marks are shown.
