Hermann-Murray Company, a corporation duly organized under the laws of the State of Minnesota, and located at Minneapolis, in the county of Hennepin and State of Minnesota, and doing business at 267 Irving Avenue, North, Minneapolis 2, Minnesota, has adopted and is using the trade-mark shown for FISH STRINGERS, in Class 22, Games, toys, and sporting goods, and presents herewith five specimens showing the trade-mark as actually used in connection with such goods, the mark being applied to cartons containing the fish stringers, and requests that the same be registered in the United States Patent Office on the Supplemental Register in accordance with the act of July 5, 1946.

The mark was first used on September 26, 1946, and was first used in commerce among the several States which may lawfully be regulated by Congress on September 26, 1946, and has been in lawful use in such commerce upon or in connection with the goods for the year preceding the filing of this application.
