STATEMENT.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that C. M. McCLUNG & Co., a corporation duly organized under the laws of the State of Tennessee, and located in the city of Knoxville, county of Knox, in said State, and doing business at Nos. 501 to 509 West Jackson avenue, in said city, has adopted for its use the trade-mark shown in the accompanying drawing.

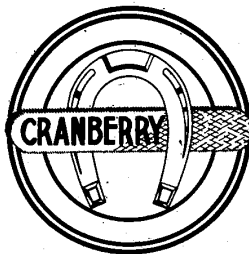
The trade mark has been continuously used in the business of said corporation and those from whom it derives its title since about the year 1893.

The particular description of goods to which the trade mark is appropriated is

targets, baseball bats, baseball gloves and mitts, baseball body protectors, lawn tennis rackets, hammocks, footballs, boxing gloves, basket balls, dumb bells, toy wagons, fishing reels, baseballs, baseball masks, lawn tennis balls, croquet sets, nose and face guards, and fishing tackle, comprised in Class 22—Games, toys, and sporting goods.

The trade mark is usually displayed by printing same on labels which are attached to packages containing the goods or which are attached directly to the goods.
